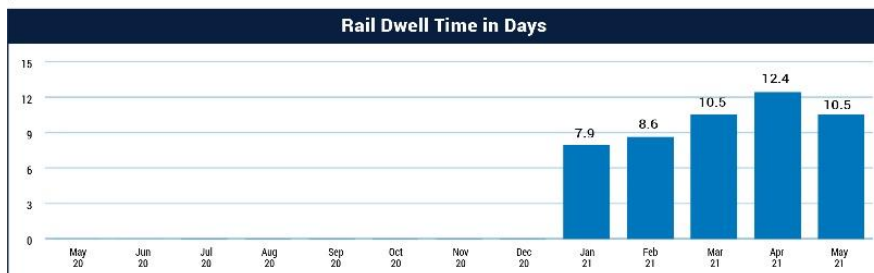
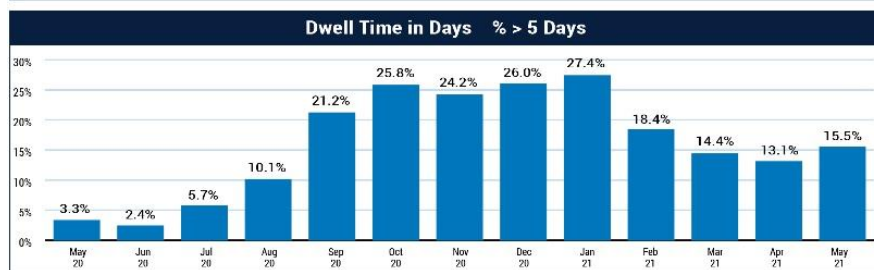
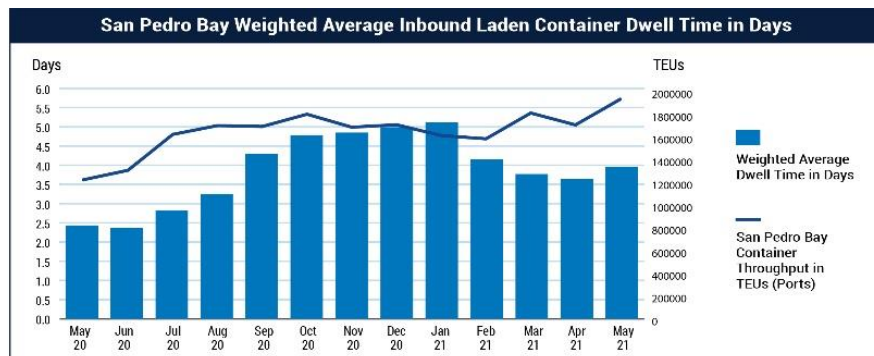

Container Dwell Time is Slightly Up for May

Container dwell time at San Pedro Bay terminals was slightly up for the month of May compared to the previous month. On average, containers remained on terminals for 4 days in April, up from 3.7 days the month before. The average number of containers that exceeded five days on a terminal was also higher, increasing from 13.1% the month before to 15.5%.

Container dwell time for cargo departing via rail displayed a slight improvement but remained high for the month of May. On average, containers stayed on terminals for 10.5 days before departing, down from 12.4 days the month before.

“While container dwell time remains higher than what we would prefer to see, our terminal operators and dock workers continue handling higher than average volumes,” explained Jessica Alvarenga, Manager of Government Affairs for the Pacific Merchant Shipping Association. “The supply chain-wide congestion caused by the uncertainties the pandemic brought have not hindered our terminals’ ability to handle our cargo.”
